



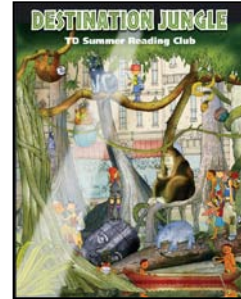

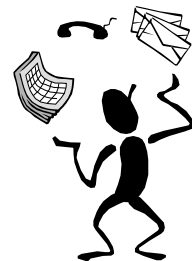
Tuesday, Aug. 10, 2 p.m.
